The University Foundation Course

Business Management

The University Foundation Course (UFC) is designed for those who need a solid year's academic study in English language in order to prepare them fully for UK university entry. The course is ideal for those who have previously studied abroad or those who require accredited qualifications in order to prepare and qualify them fully for undergraduate study in the UK. The UFC is an academic alternative to the traditional A-Level (see page 8) and is recognized by many UK Universities including: Royal Holloway; East Anglia; Sheffield; Leicester; Newcastle; Oxford Brookes; Birmingham; Aston; York; Sussex; Brunel; Coventry and most recently, King's College London. Upon successful completion of the course we help our scholars to apply via the central UCAS system to 5 UK universities.

The world of business is becoming increasingly competitive and students need to be equipped with the knowledge and skills to be effective managers. The Buckswood St George's College UFC Business Management course covers every facet of the business world from organisation and structure, marketing, finance and human resources and can be combined with other courses available at Buckswood St George's College.

A student graduating from Buckswood St George's College will have the practical skills to thrive in the business world or study business at degree level and students are guided through the UK university entrance process. In a world where students are competing on a global stage, the St George's College UFC gives its graduates the necessary edge to get them that one step further.

The University Foundation Course

International Relations

The study of International Relations explores how the relations of power are deployed at all levels of social and political life. It will consider the effects of empirical structures, global conflicts, the modern consequences of historical treaties as well as current issues surrounding national security. There are many varied and interesting careers open to graduates of International Relations, particularly involving overseas travel. These include the diplomatic corps, the armed forces, intelligence and risk analysis, relief and humanitarian work, the United Nations and International Business to name but a few.

Studying International Relations will provide students with essential transferable skills including writing, presenting, research and analysis skills. Equally importantly International Relations will provide students with the tools to make sense of the complex world around them, to think on their feet and consider international issues and events from a wide variety of perspectives.

The University Foundation Programme (UFP) is a one-year intensive course that is recognised by a wide range of universities in the United Kingdom. It is designed as an alternative to the A-Level route but can be studied whilst undertaking BTEC and A-Level subjects. The course is assessed on a ratio of 80:20, examinations make up the latter and two pieces of coursework weigh the former.

This course heavily values research and coursework assignments.

The course can be combined with IELTS preparation.

Upon successful completion of the course we help our scholars to apply via the central UCAS system to 5 UK universities.

Our experienced staff offer full support to students throughout the UCAS process and the majority of students reach their first university

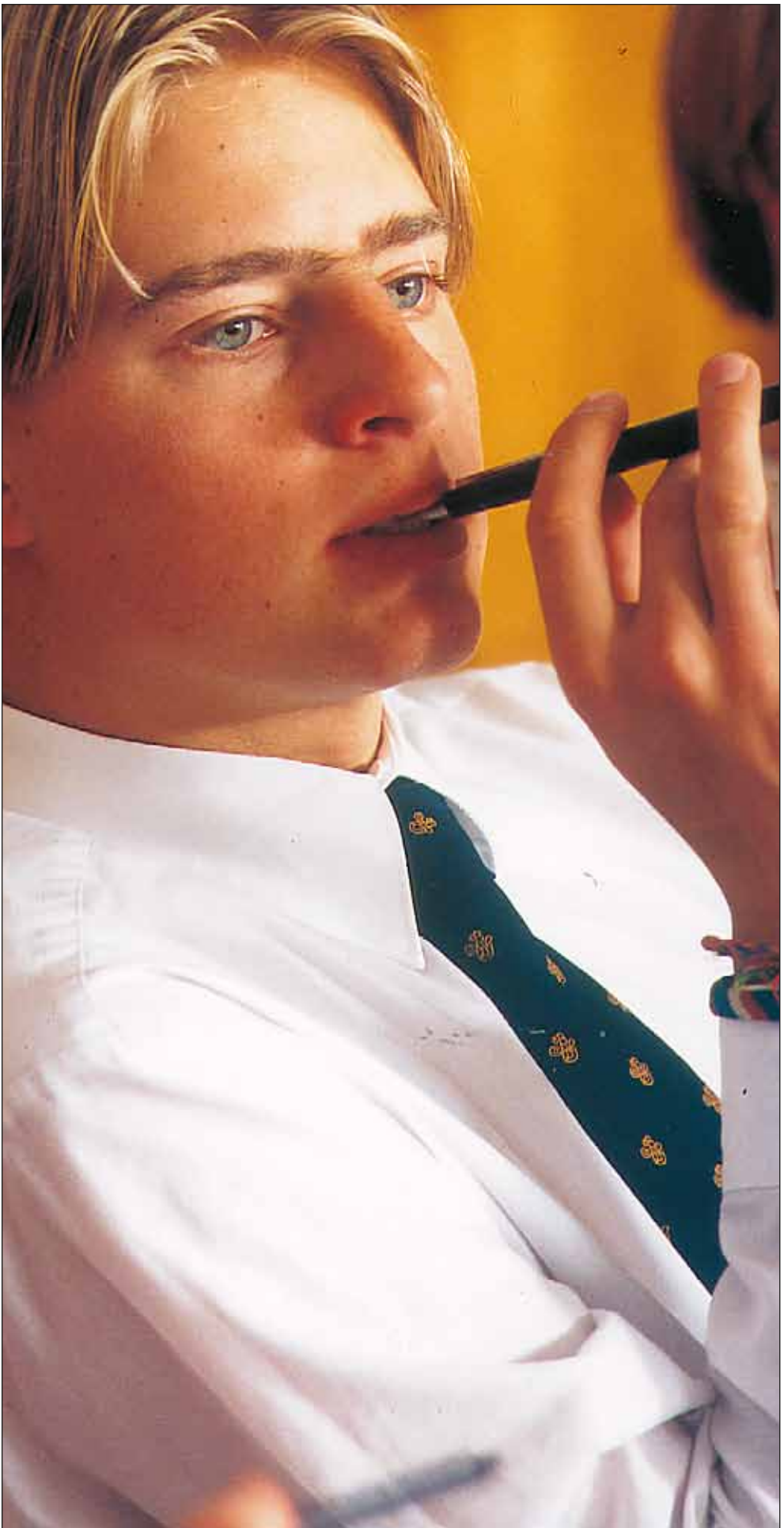

A-Levels

A-Levels are an advanced focus on specific subject areas. Students are able to study their chosen subjects in greater depth and detail and these are the traditional route to higher education. The majority of students complete their A-Levels between the ages of 16-18 in order to apply to university, although they are also useful when choosing to go straight into paid work or in order to train as an apprentice.

A-Levels were changed in 2000 to GCE A-Levels, introducing a separate AS and A2 Level in order for students to be able to broaden their knowledge of their subjects. A-Levels are usually spaced out over 2 years and made up of 2 units: AS and A2 Levels. Students will usually pick four AS-Levels to study during the first year and then drop one of the subjects the next year when they complete their A-Levels.

AS-Levels can stand as a qualification on their own or can be carried on to A2 the next year to complete the full A-Level qualification. At Buckswood St George's College we offer a wide range of A-Level subjects that can lead to a wider choice of university degree courses. Our language courses are taught by a team of native speaking tutors who can not only teach the language but also give valuable insights into culture and international business practices; giving our graduates that all important edge.

1 Year A-Level – (Fast Track)

This course is designed for students wishing to take 2 or 3 A-Levels in one academic year (September to June). Students are taught in small groups with an average of 5/6 per class, so that our students each receive the individual attention they require. With each subject is allocated nine 40 minute lessons per week, this gives a total of 6 hours with the teacher per A-Level subject per week. All A-Level students also have weekly individual tutorials with their subject tutor, this ensures ongoing support and guidance during their course. Those wishing to take this course must sit a pre-entry test. This course is intense and scholars must be prepared for this. (This is a two year course taken in one year)

2 Year A-Level

Buckswood St George's College also offers the traditional 2 year A-Level course. Students can select up to 3 subjects, they also have the option to study a native language. All teaching at AS and A2 is in small groups of 5/6. Each subject is allocated nine 40 minute lessons per week, giving a total of 6 hours teaching per subject per week. All students attend weekly tutorials with their subject teacher, this ensures ongoing support throughout the course. All students receive expert UCAS guidance.

Assessment

- 1 Students will be assessed through set coursework
- 2 Students will sit externally marked examinations in each subject at the end of the year.
- 3 One weekly Friday test
- 4 Three written exams per term
- 5 Mock exams in January

English Courses

English is a global language. It is used as a first, second and foreign language by close to one billion people around the world. Its global reach has made it one of the most successful means of international communication in history.

The English language is a passport to a global business career and at Buckswood St George's College there is an accredited course to suit your skill level and take you to the next step.

IELTS

The IELTS academic examination course is for those students wishing to gain accreditation for their language skills in order to secure a place at a university in an English speaking country.

The focus of the course is on each of the four graded skills and will involve exam strategies as well as language practice. This course is aimed at learners with a current IELTS grade of 5.0. In your first week at the school you will be tested and those not deemed to be at this level may be moved into a General English class for a recommended period of time where your skills can be better progressed at a pace more suited to your abilities.

When your teachers assess your skills to be more suited to IELTS study you will be moved back to the IELTS course.

LAMDA

If a young adult wishes to impress, he or she must be able to speak clearly and confidently in public. A professional actor teaches the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts 'Using Spoken English' courses, coaching scholars in the time-honoured skills of voice production, eye contact, breath control and body language. Well-structured speeches are prepared and delivered on topics ranging from tyrants to tree-houses, all good practice for the demands of university or job interviews. As a bonus, LAMDA candidates are awarded UCAS points worth another A-Level.

General English

The language course objectives are:

- to advance your general level of English
- to practise and develop language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing)
- to build expertise and confidence in English language usage (grammar consolidation and pronunciation practice)
- to develop and extend your vocabulary usage
- to develop your learner independence

This course is aimed at students who need an overall improvement in English language skills, with a predominant focus on verbal communicative skills. The course aims to develop your English language knowledge and give you greater confidence in spoken English through a classroom focus on real-life communication skills.

However the school will assess individual needs and tailor the course to suit as necessary, such as including grammar workshops and the production of written texts to name but a few.

Leadership Course

All Buckswood St George's College students are automatically enrolled onto our Student Leadership Programme. This culminates in an ASDAN leadership award.

Students will be encouraged to take on responsibilities that, whilst show individual development also result in the greater collective performance of the student body. The competitive spirit that exists in educational establishments will be used to inspire teamwork and also show students the challenges of leading peers.

There are four themes that can be linked to leadership and the programme offered at BSGC:

Responsibility

Leaders are responsible for everything that occurs in their organisation. The phrase 'the buck stops here' cannot be stressed enough. Students will take on the challenges of being responsible for the student body as a whole and this includes but is not restricted to:

Class attendance	Event organisation
Room checks	Overseeing evening prep time

Students will be judged on their ability to accept and assume responsibility. Some will actively seek it and others will shy away. Some will carry out the duties without fuss whilst others will show their impact on all those around them. We do not expect any two students to be the same and all will be shown how different approaches to getting things done have vastly different results.

Lead by Example

The characteristics of successful leaders are likely to be imitated by those who interact with them and so their leadership behaviour is of critical importance. Students will be given the opportunity to show their true selves and will, through the processes above, see how their behaviour affects those around them. Students will be guided towards best practice at all times.

Development

People never stop learning and for students to realise their full leadership potential they need to have the humility and willingness to address mistakes they make and take action to improve. Students will be encouraged to question the status quo, suggest how to improve current 'best practices' and look for personal challenges. Students will become involved in aspects of the college that include:

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Judgement

Leaders learn to make decisions quickly but through carefully considered options, weighing up consequences. Students at BSGC will be introduced to decision making processes including SWOT and the 3 column estimate. They will be involved in classes that introduce moral dilemmas to be used as the basis for discussion on ethical decision making. Students will also be given planning exercises and assessed on their ability to assimilate the information and produce a course of action



Curriculum Enhancement

The Duke of Edinburgh Award: The scheme encourages students to be active and healthy through taking up a sport for a year, through outdoor adventures including camping and trekking around the UK's most beautiful countryside..

Charity Work The college supports three charities. At local level we support St Michael's Hospice, nationally the MacMillan Nurses and internationally the Swaziland Royal Children's Projects. Students are encouraged to join one of these organisations supporting them either by a hands on approach or through fund raising.

Buckswood St George's College

The newly refurbished Buckswood St George's College is located in the heart of Hastings. The residency is combined within the college and as such offers a comfortable, affordable and safe home away from home. There are separate boarding houses for males and females and rooms are all comfortably furnished and have WI-FI capabilities. Accommodating between one and three people, the majority offer en-suite facilities or shared toilet and shower between two rooms. There are social areas, equipped with football tables, pool tables and sofas for students to relax in and a student kitchen – the perfect preparation for university living.

Things academic

Academic Support

All students enrolled on a course lasting for 4 weeks or more will have weekly tutorials with the Director of Studies. This is an opportunity for both parties to discuss any issues that may have arisen. We operate an Open Door policy, so students can approach the management team at any time if they have concerns. Buckswood St George's College also runs a VLE system that all students must be logged onto upon enrolment

Attendance

Twice daily roll calls are taken and are registered on the College eportal system.

Parental Feedback and Reports

Parents have access to the Buckswood St George's College eportal system and weekly short reports are sent to parents. We encourage parents to write to us, education is a three way process, your child, the College and you, the parent. We want to encourage work that has been done well, and we want to keep you informed of this.

Additional Academic Support

The school is located only 5 minutes walk away from Hastings main library where students on long-term programmes are enrolled and access additional academic resources. In addition we are also only 5 minutes walk away from Sussex Coast College, part of Brighton University, and their academic facilities.

Material

All material required for courses is provided by Buckswood St George's College and is included in the fees. Students may wish to purchase additional material to assist their studies and will be advised where this can be bought from at the most reasonable price.

General Welfare

Food

All meals are catered for on-site and freshly prepared by our team of chefs.

Sports

Sports membership to the nearby Summerfields Sports Centre is included and access to the horse-riding, sports and recreation facilities at Buckswood main school ensure that students can maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Medical Issues

Buckswood St George's College takes the well-being of its students very seriously. We have two qualified First Aiders on site, one of which is residential. Buckswood has two nurses that can be called upon. There is a health centre not more than 10 minutes from the College and a hospital in the town.

Security

In addition to CCTV on the premises there are pass code combination locks for each building. The Buckswood Group run police checks of all their full-time staff and require all staff to adhere to the Buckswood Group Child Protection Policy. In addition all of the staff have a full Child Protection induction programme. All staff are fully briefed about the importance of welfare of the students so you can be assured your child is in good hands.
